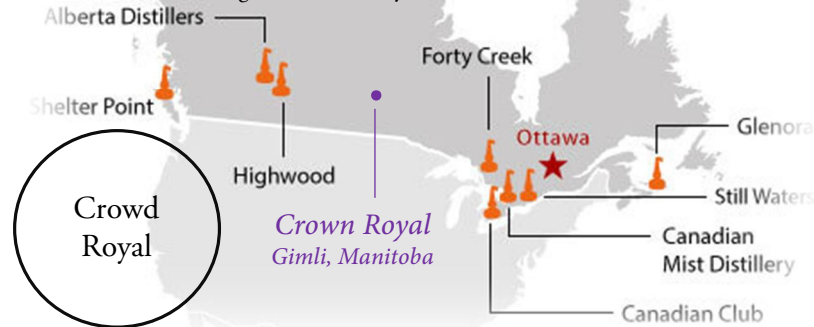


CANADIAN WHISKEY

Typically corn based, not regulated. Generally a blend.



Crowd Royal

Crowd Royal made in 1939 for King George VI and Queen Elizabeth's visit. Blend of corn, barley, and rye distillates.

BOURBON

Mash at least 51% corn
New Charred Oak Barrels
Distilled at 160 proof or less
Barreled at 125 proof or less
No additives

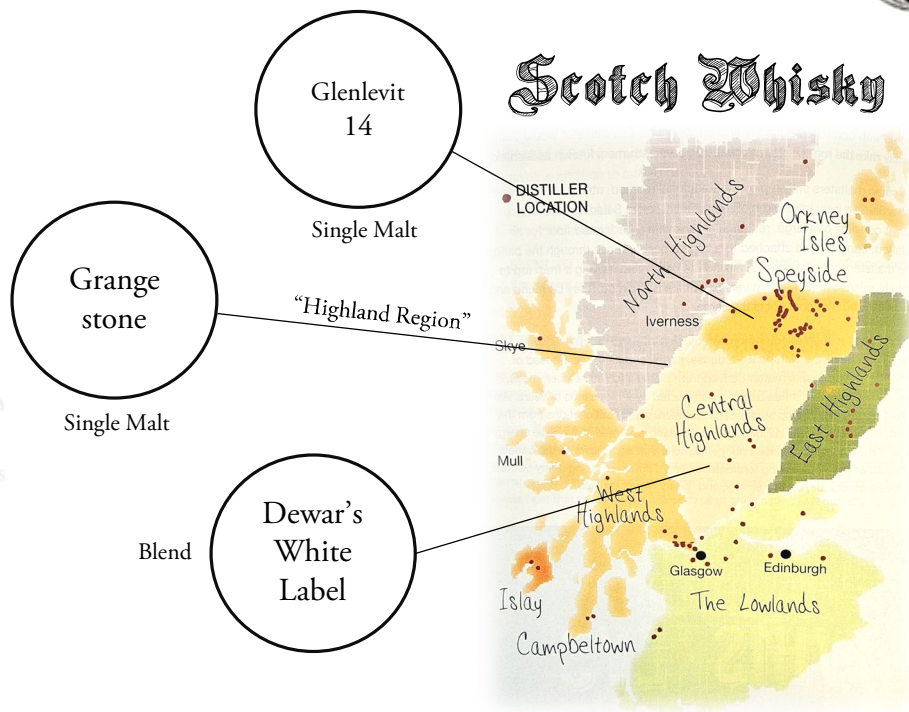

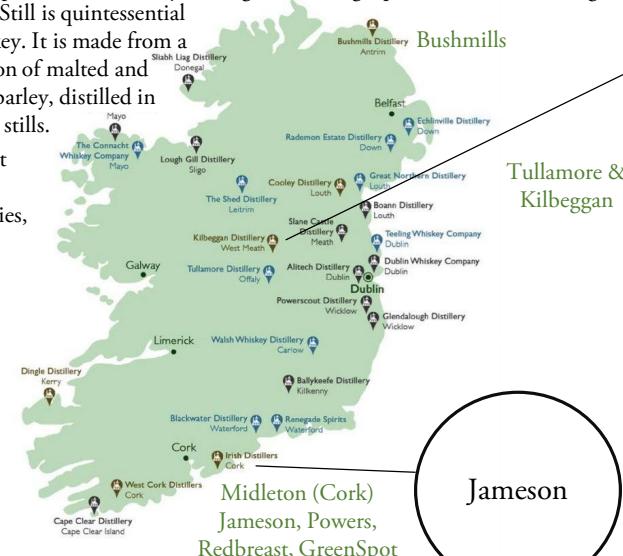
Either malt whisky, grain whisky, or a combination of malt and grain whisky. Scottish whiskies have to age for 3 yrs in an oak barrel. Min 40% ABV. 141 distilleries.

Irish Whiskey

The four types of Irish whiskey — single malt, single pot still, blended, and grain.

Single Pot Still is quintessential Irish whiskey. It is made from a combination of malted and unmalted barley, distilled in copper pot stills.

Must age at least 3 yrs, 32 distilleries,
